



Until Everyone Can Read: Children's Books Representing Dyslexic Readers

The proposed collection supports inclusive children's literature by combining authentic representation of characters with dyslexia and accessible, evidence-based information about how reading works. NOBIDA would work with each library to identify titles not already in its collection and donate only those books, based on the library's catalog and preferences, to expand access to dyslexia-inclusive materials.
