Teaching handwriting is an important skill for reading, writing and spelling. Yet, statistically, teachers spend little time on handwriting instruction and explicit practice. This session will demonstrate the importance of understanding graphemes, why letter formation is critically important and how to teach children accurately for automaticity using key research and strategies for handwriting.
